

## NCHD FLOOD RELIEF ACTIVITIES

#### Flood Relief Activity Report (September 27- October 4, 2010)

#### National Commission for Human Development's (NCHD) Relief Work:

NCHD as per its mandate "to support the provincial / district governments in UPE and Adult Literacy is operational in all 142 districts (four provinces, AJK, GB, and FATA less North & South Waziristan) of Pakistan". NCHD, in coordination with Provincial as well as District Administration is actively supporting flood relief operations ever since 30<sup>th</sup> July 2010, commencing from Charsadda and Nowshera in Khyber Pakhtoonkhwa, and now working in the entire flood affected districts of Pakistan. It has provided rescue teams with boats, mobile and static emergency health teams with essential medicines, food items, clean drinking water and tents for shelter to the flood affectees. NCHD's flood relief operations are being carried out through public private partnership:

- <u>Rescue & Evacuation</u>: NCHD has rescued 16,975 marooned people using 104 boats, 45,743 people using 193 vehicles while 25,600 people using 3 trains during rescue operation. This operation has been completed. <u>Punjab</u>: A total of 2,989 marooned people using 62 boats, 3,936 people rescued using 90 vehicles in Khushab, Rajanpur, Layyah, Mandi Bahauddin, Muzafargarh and RahimYar Khan. <u>Sindh</u>: A total of 5,471 marooned people using 25 boats, 4,1407 people rescued using 98 vehicles in Badin, Dadu, Hyderabad, Jamshoro, Jacobabad, Kamber Shadadkot, Karachi, Khairpur, Larkana, Shikarpur, T.M.Khan and Thatta. while 25,600 people were rescued using 3 trains in Jacobabad. <u>KPK</u>: A total of 8,515 marooned people using 17 boats, 400 people rescued using 5 vehicles in Nowshera, Charsadda, Malakand, Laki Marwat and Mardan.
- 2. <u>Provision of Shelter</u>: NCHD has provided **1,786** tents to provide shelter to the flood affected displaced families during flood disaster.
- 3. Dry Rations: NCHD has provided dry rations to 74,160 families in flood affected districts across the country. Punjab: A total of 9,988 dry food bags distributed in 7 NCHD Managed Camps: Khushab, Layyah, Bhakkar, Mandi Bahauddin, Muzafargarh, Lodhran and Multan while 20,243 dry food bags were distributed in 8 Flood Relief Camps managed by any other agency: Khushab, Rajan pur, Sargodha, Mianwali, D.G.Khan, Muzafargarh, Rahim yar Khan and Multan. Sindh: A total of 14,709 dry food bags distributed in 13 NCHD Managed Camps: Badin, Dadu, Ghotki, Jamshoro, Jacobabad, Karachi, Kashmore, Khairpur, Larkana, Mitiari, Shikarpur, Sukkur and Thatta. NCHD is still providing dry ration in Badin, Dadu, Jamshoro, Khairpur, Shikarpur and Sukkur while 24,009 dry food bags were distributed in 14 Flood Relief Camps managed by any other agency: Badin, Hyderabad Ghotki, Jamshoro, Jacobabad, Kanapur, Sukkur, T.A. Yar, T.M.Khan and Thatta. KPK: A total of 1,500 dry food bags distributed in 2 NCHD Managed Camps: Charsadda, Kohistan (included 150 bags provided by Mansehra), while 3,710 dry food bags were distributed in 9 Flood Relief Camps managed by any other agency: Nowshera, Swat, Upper Dir, Tank, Mardan, Karak, Lakimarwat, Buner, Shangla
- 4. <u>Cooked Food:</u> NCHD has provided cooked food to 373,452 flood affected people. This activity has been completed because people have moved back from IDPs camps to their locations. <u>Punjab</u>: An average of 6,821 individuals were provided cooked food on daily basis in Khushab, Rajan pur, Layyah, Mianwali, D.G.Khan, Muzafargarh and Multan (A total of 143,761 individuals provided cooked food) <u>Sindh</u>: An average of 18,258 individuals were provided cooked food on daily basis in Badin, Ghotki, Jacobabad, Kashmore, Khairpur, Shikarpur and Sukkur (A total of 172,037 individuals provided cooked food). While cooked food on daily basis in Nowshera, Charsadda, D.I.Khan, Bannu, Mardan ((A total of 57,654 individuals provided cooked food)
- 5. <u>Provision of Water:</u> NCHD has provided **47,596** clean drinking bottled water and **1,344** tankers (treated with Aqua Tabs) in districts affected by severe flood. <u>Punjab</u>: A total of **20,979** water

bottles were provided (An average of **3,400** water bottles provided on daily basis) in Khushab, Layyah and D.G.Khan). Similarly water was also provided through **555** water tankers to **22,164** beneficiaries (families) in Khushab and Muzafargarh during the entire relief operation. Total **10** water filtration units were installed in Layyah, NCHD is still providing water bottles in Layyah. **Sindh**: A total of **9,334** water bottles were provided (An average of **1,167** water bottles provided on daily basis) in Badin, Dadu, Hyderabad, Jacobabad, Kamber Shadadkot, Kashmore, Khairpur, Larkana, Mitiari, Shikarpur, T.A.Yar, T.M.Khan and Sukkur). Similarly water was also provided through **547** water tankers to **44,031** beneficiaries (families) in Badin, Dadu, Jacobabad, Jamshoro, Karachi, Kashmore, Khairpur, T.A.Yar, Sukkur and Thatta. NCHD is still providing water through tankers and water bottles in Badin, Khairpur, Sukkur and Thatta. <u>KPK:</u> A total of **2444** water bottles were provided (An average of **17,283** water bottles provided on daily basis in Nowshera, Charsadda, Malakand, Swat, Mardan, Swabi and Abbottabad. Similarly water was also provided through **242** water tankers to **200** beneficiaries (families) in Malakand and Lower Dir.

- 6. Medical Assistance: NCHD has held 1,128 medical camps, treating 186,238 patients in (338 static and 790 mobile camps, treating 82,501 and 103,737 patients respectively) till date. **Punjab**: A total of 47 static medical camps held, treating 23,943 patients in Khushab, Rajan pur, Layyah, Bhakar, Sargodha, Jhelum, Mianwali, Jhang, D.G.Khan, Mandibahudin, RahimYar Khan, Lodhran and Multan (An average of 42 static medical camps held, treating 3,230 patients on daily basis) Similarly total **73** mobile medical camps held, treating **44,348** patients in Khushab, Rajan pur, Lavyah, Bhakar, Muzafargarh and RahimYar Khan (An average of 4 mobile medical camps held, treating 73 patients on daily basis) while static and mobile medical assistance is being provided in Layyah. Sindh: A total of 111 static medical camps held, treating 29,038 patients in Badin, Dadu, Jacobabad, Jamshoro, Kashmore, Khairpur, Shaheed Benazirabad, Shikarpur, Thatta and Sukkur (An average of 24 static medical camps held, treating 947 patients on daily basis) while static medical assistance is being provided in Badin, Dadu, Shikarpur, Sukkur and Thatta. Similarly total **394** mobile medical camps held, treating **19,954** patients in Dadu, Jacobabad, Jamshoro, Khairpur, Sukkur and Thatta (An average of 15 mobile medical camps held, treating **692** patients on daily basis) while mobile medical assistance is being provided in Khairpur, Sukkur and Thatta. KPK: A total of 174 static medical camps held, treating 26,430 patients in Nowshera, Charsadda, Malakand, Lower Dir, Swat, Upper Dir, D.I.Khan, Shangla, Mansehra, Bannu, Mardan, Haripur and Abbottabad (An average of 24 static medical camps held, treating 3,105 patients on daily basis) Similarly total 323 mobile medical camps held, treating 39,435 patients in Nowshera, Charsadda, Swat, Mardan (An average of 10 mobile medical camps held, treating 1,477 patients on daily basis) while static and mobile medical assistance is being provided in Charsadda and Nowshera.
- 7. <u>Non Food Items (NFIs)</u>: NCHD has provided 695 mattress/ sleeping bags, 290 Aqua Boxes with filtration units, 2,077 plastic sheets. Likewise 964 hygiene kits were distributed. 24,908 pair of shoes and clothes were provided throughout the country. <u>Punjab</u>: Total 198 mattress/ sleeping bags, 50 Aqua Boxes with filtration units, 315 plastic sheets, 246 water coolers. Likewise 1,515 pair of shoes and clothes were distributed. <u>Sindh</u>: Total 426 mattress/ sleeping bags, 1,575 plastic sheets, 2,336 water coolers. Likewise 1,4154 pair of shoes and clothes were distributed. <u>KPK</u>: Total 71 mattress/ sleeping bags, 140 Aqua Boxes with filtration units, 680 plastic sheets, 113 water coolers. Likewise 9,239 pair of shoes and clothes were distributed. <u>Balochistan</u>: 100 Aqua Boxes with filtration units provided.
- 8. <u>Volunteers' Support</u>: NCHD has also identified and facilitated **5,697** volunteers to support relief activities in IDP camps, out of which **3,069** volunteers have been registered.

Charsadda) comprising of **250** families (1,370 persons). In these camps NCHD is providing security, registration facilities, food, clean drinking water and essential health care on daily basis.

- Education, Awareness & Recreational Activities: NCHD is providing Temporary Learning and Recreational Sites (TLRS) (5-10 years old children) and Adult Literacy Social Counseling Centers (ALSCC) (11 years +) in flood relief camps to engage the flood affected people in order to help them overcome the trauma / distress.
  - TLRS:- 270 TLRS have been established with an induction of 17,817 students. <u>Punjab:</u> 37( Muzafargarh, Rahimyar Khan, Multan and Lodhran) having 3,351 students, all TLRS have been closed now. <u>Sindh:</u> 231 (Badin:74, Dadu:7, Ghotki:18, Hyderabad:2, Jamshoro:2, Kamber Shadadkot:25, Karachi:2, Kashmore:4, Khairpur:16, Larkana:38, Nousheroferoze:10, Shaheed Benazir:2, Shikarpur:2, Sukkur:15, T.M.Khan:2, Thatta:12) having 14,316 students, while TLRS have been closed in Badin, Ghotki, Hyderabad, Kamber Shadadkot, Kashmore, Larkana. <u>KPK:</u> 2 (Nowshera) having 200 students, both TLRS are functionals.
  - Adult Literacy Social Counseling Centers (ALSCC):- established 181 centers with an induction of 4,704 learners in Sindh (Badin:10, Dadu:10, Ghotki:5, Hyderabad:5, Jamshoro:5, Kamber Shadadkot:20, Karachi:14, Kashmore:3, Khairpur:15, Larkana:17, Mitiari:5, Nousheroferoze:11, Sanghar:1, Shaheed Benazir:15, Shikarpur:17, Sukkur:24, T.M.Khan:2, Thatta:2)

# NCHD is carrying out relief operations from donations alone, and no government funds are being used for this purpose.

**Donations:** Board Members of Pakistan Human Development Fund, Pakistan Human Development Fund -UK, American Fund for Human Development (AFHD) and other philanthropists from within Pakistan and abroad have pledged **Rs. 136.32 million** out of which **Rs. 100.62 million** has already been received, including cash and in-kind donations. The total in-kind donation is **Rs.39.49 million** which includes **Rs.23.45 million** mobilized by NCHD district offices.
