

Child Centers Established at Tent Villages

“At night there was announcement from the mosque’s loudspeaker that the water was coming, and later on our house was full with water. My father brought me out on his shoulders and I was very afraid. Water took away my cute little black goat and everything we had in our house”, says Saira, a girl of 12 from a small village of Sukkhur.



Saira told NCHD that animals were the only source of income for her family. She is traumatized by the cruel waters which have washed away every belonging of her family. She is now living in a tent camp at Sukkhur where NCHD is not only providing relief items but has also established child centers. These child centers are helping children like Saira to deal with the grave state of affairs at present and rehabilitation after floods.



NCHD has adopted **15** relief camps across Sindh province, where food, water, clothing, health facilities, and other services are being provided through field offices. Besides, literacy centers and transitional schools/child centers have been established at these camps.



53 Schools (School in a Box) in collaboration with UNICEF have been established in Sindh, while **91** Adult Literacy Centers, having an enrollment of **1,775** are operational in Sindh province.
