NCHD Collaboration with different Stakeholders for promoting education and literacy in Balochistan


The National Commission for Human Development (NCHD) and the University of Balochistan (UOB) have formally signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to strengthen partnership under the Each One Teach One (EOTO) initiative on 1st October, 2025.

The collaboration aims to enhance literacy, education, and community development across Balochistan by mobilizing youth, academic institutions, and civil society for the success of the EOTO program. Both organizations reaffirmed their commitment to make this initiative impactful and assured continued collaboration in future endeavors.



In a connective move NCHD held a productive meeting with Inspector General Prisons Balochistan Capt. Saeed, to explore avenues of cooperation for the educational and social rehabilitation of prisoners across the province. During the meeting, both sides engaged in detailed discussions on the establishment of literacy centers in prisons, the Each One Teach One (EOTO) initiative, skill development opportunities, and broader rehabilitation programs for inmates. The focus remained on equipping prisoners with education and skills that will enable their reintegration into society as responsible citizens.

This partnership reflects a shared commitment to providing prisoners with hope, opportunities, and a chance to rebuild their lives. Through collaborative efforts, the initiative aims to promote rehabilitation, literacy, and empowerment, ultimately contributing to a better future for those incarcerated. In recognition of the partnership, the Inspector General of Prisons presented a Shield of Honor to the Director General of NCHD, symbolizing appreciation for their dedication to this noble cause.



Coordination Meeting with Baluchistan Rural Support Program -2nd October



NCHD held a cordial meeting with Mr. Malik Anwar Saleem Kasi, Chairman Balochistan Rural Support Program (BRSP) and NCHD Commission Member, at his office, on 2nd October, 2025. During the meeting, the DG-NCHD presented an overview of NCHD's interventions in Balochistan, highlighting its robust field presence, trained human resource, and contributions to improving literacy rates and Human Development Index (HDI). He emphasized that partnerships with organizations like BRSP can enhance community-based education and literacy models, particularly in underserved rural areas.

Chairman BRSP lauded NCHD's efforts in promoting education and literacy in Balochistan, acknowledging its grassroots presence across districts. He assured full support for joint initiatives, stressing the importance of aligning resources to maximize outreach and impact. The meeting concluded with a shared commitment to collaborate on education and literacy programs, aiming to uplift marginalized communities in Balochistan.

NCHD Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Office Holds Productive Meeting with Secretary Education KP to Drive Educational Excellence

The NCHD Provincial Office team, led by Mr. Anwar Iqbal, Director Operations Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, on November 6, 2025 convened a pivotal meeting with Mr. Khalid Khan, Secretary Education KP, to review progress, achievements, and future strategies aimed at augmenting literacy and educational development across the province.

During the meeting, Mr. Anwar Iqbal presented a comprehensive overview of NCHD's accomplishments and ongoing initiatives, highlighting key projects, including:

- Construction of 60 schools under the KS Relief project in 14 districts, enhancing access to quality education
- UNICEF-funded Recovery of Education Project in 6 districts, supporting vulnerable communities

- Jail Literacy Program, empowering marginalized groups through education
- Each One Teach One (EOTO) initiative, fostering community-led literacy drives

- Out-of-School Children (OSC) survey in District Swabi, identifying vulnerable populations

NCHD striving for Provision of Quality Education to Marginalized Communities through Community Schools

NCHD is implementing a range of activities in its community schools across Islamabad to provide access and ensure quality education to marginalized and deprived children, particularly those falling in the Out-of-School Children (OOSC) category. In order to ensure quality education following steps are considered.

Non-Formal Education (NFE) Classes focusing Joyful & Activity based Learning Approach: NCHD is conducting NFE classes in its community schools, targeting children who have never attended school or have dropped out. Key goal is to enable children aged 5 to 10 to acquire foundational skills quickly and sustainably, so they can meaningfully benefit from further educational opportunities.



Co-curricular activities are also organized for these children, in addition to academic pursuits, with the aim of promoting discipline, confidence, and showcasing the innate talents of the learners.



Accelerated Learning Program (ALP): NCHD is implementing ALP in its community schools to provide accelerated learning opportunities to OOSC children, most of the ALPs are in Madaris, enabling them to catch up with their peers and mainstream into formal education.



Professional Development and Capacity Enhancement of Teachers: NCHD is providing training and capacity-building opportunities to its teachers, equipping them with innovative teaching methodologies and strategies, enabling them to deliver high-quality education and support the academic success of their students. 600 teachers receiving training course from Allama Iqbal Open University. 1000 teachers received a comprehensive training of NFE and ALP in 2025.



School Readiness Program: NCHD is implementing a school readiness program, preparing children for transition to formal education and ensuring a smooth integration into the mainstream education system.

Physical Health & Psychosocial Support: NCHD is providing Physical Health & psychosocial support to OOSC children, addressing their Physical Health & emotional and psychological needs, and promoting a supportive learning environment.



School Management Committee Meetings (SMCs); are a crucial component of a school's governance structure, playing a significant role in ensuring the school's overall effectiveness and efficiency. All the community schools have their SMCs and regular monthly meetings are held playing their role in improved academic performance, increased parental involvement, enhanced teacher support and better resource management.



Facilitation and Monitoring Visits: To ensure the smooth functioning of community schools, regular facilitation and monitoring visits are conducted. These visits aim to provide support and guidance to schools, focusing on improving facilities and teaching methodologies. The facilitation visits enable the team to identify areas of improvement and provide necessary resources and training to enhance the overall quality of education.



The Monitoring and Evaluation department also conducts regular visits to identify strengths and weaknesses, enabling the team to take corrective actions and make data-driven decisions to improve the overall effectiveness of the program.

NCHD Honors ETO Volunteers Teachers at University of Sargodha

NCHD recently organized a certificate distribution ceremony at the University of Sargodha, recognizing the outstanding efforts of 165 student who volunteer who participated in the Prime Minister's "Each One, Teach One" (ETO) initiative. This program, a collaborative effort between NCHD and the University of Sargodha, aims to promote basic literacy and numeracy skills across the country

The ceremony was graced by Director General NCHD, Ali Asghar, and Vice Chancellor, University of Sargodha, Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas, who praised the volunteers for their dedication to empowering underprivileged members of society. DG NCHD Ali Asghar highlighted the program's goal of reaching 100,000 illiterate individuals nationwide, while Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas announced plans to expand the university's participation, targeting 500 graduates to teach illiterate persons in their communities.



The EOTO program has made a significant impact, with the 165 student volunteers imparting basic education to illiterate individuals over a three-month period. The ceremony concluded with the presentation of certificates of appreciation to the volunteers, recognizing their commendable efforts in promoting literacy and contributing to national progress.

Unlocking Potential: NCHD's Middle-Tech ALP Program Empowers Pakistan's Youth!

NCHD has launched the Accelerated Learning Program (ALP) Middle Technical Education, a pioneering initiative aimed at equipping out-of-school youth with market-relevant technical skills. This program is being implemented in collaboration with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), a leading international development partner and Pakistan Human Development Fund in 15 districts countrywide.



The ALP Middle Tech Program is 18 months course, designed to provide young people with hands-on training in various technical trades, including: - Electrical Wiring, Plumbing, Masonry, Carpentry, Mobile Phone Repair Computer Hardware and Networking. 1756 learners of the initiative had successfully completed D and technical skills are to be imparted in the last Package E. In this connection a detailed review meeting was held in NCHD headquarters, country Representative JICA and their core team attended the meeting.

The ALP Middle Tech Program's curriculum, developed with industry experts, provides hands-on training, internships, and job placement support, equipping trainees with skills for the local job market, as part of NCHD and JICA's collaborative efforts to promote technical education and vocational training, supporting Pakistan's socio-economic development.

Joint visit of NCHD Head Office and KS Relief team to Community Schools site areas under construction: Mansehra

A team of officials from the NCHD Education Department, led by the Head Office, and KS-Relief conducted a joint visit to Mansehra on December 11, 2025. The purpose of the visit was to inspect the construction sites of community schools and review the progress of the project.

During the visit, the team inspected three school sites, engaging with the local community, students, teachers, volunteers, PTC members, community representatives, and ESEF officials. The team provided a comprehensive briefing on the overall project implementation plan, discussing progress, challenges, and future plans.



The community members and teachers expressed their gratitude to the KS Relief team for their valuable support to the deprived students of these schools. Before visiting sites a review meeting was held in Head office of NCHD to share progress of the project.

Lifelong Learning Corner Established at NCHD Resource Center

The NCHD Resource Center now features a Lifelong Learning Corner, established under the guidance of Director General Ali Asghar. This initiative aims to promote continuous learning and provides a dedicated space with carefully curated materials on:

- Early Childhood Education (ECE)
- Adult Learning
- Community Learning
- Non-Formal Education



Dissemination of Research-Based Articles

To foster a culture of continuous learning, the Resource Center effectively contributed to the Learning Platform Series by disseminating research-based and reflective articles on the official learning platform, focusing on lifelong learning, community engagement, and innovative approaches in non-formal education, thereby supporting officers' professional development and facilitating knowledge exchange across the organization.

Special Initiatives of NCHD

Apart from our regular program regarding Literacy and UPE, NCHD in collaboration with different partners carried out different initiatives as special projects that are aligned to Health, Education, Disaster Management, Mass Awareness and skill enhancement across the country.

Engaging Education Officials/SMCs for Increased Equitable Enrollment Using Social Behavior Change (SBC) Approaches.

Sindh faces a severe education crisis with around 8 million out-of-school children, disproportionately affecting girls. In District Sujawal, 74.91% of children (516 years) are out of school (Census 2023). NCHD in partnership with UNICEF and SELD, had piloted this project in Sujawal district of Sindh.

In this connection district and UC-level training for education officials, teachers, SMCs, and volunteers was held to mobilize community conducting door-to-door campaigns and awareness sessions. Mass awareness campaign was launched by NCHD organizing rallies at district, Taluka and UC level.



UNICEF Education Recovery Project


NCHD under the project visited flood affected districts in KPK (Mansehra, Shangla, Swat, Buner, Lower Dir, Abbotabad) and conducted survey of the students affected, 240 schools were damaged discontinuing the education of 55,000 students. NCHD KPK team provided school supplies at 20 locations and established Temporary Learning Centre in these districts.

Drug Rehabilitation Center Abbottabad

One NCHD- Supported Drug Rehabilitation Center is functional at District Jail where 15 inmates are being provided functional literacy and life skills.

Vocational Skill Centers at Charsadda

NCHD provided vocational skills in 5 centers at Charsadda in collaboration with ILM o Hunar, where 100 learners acquired different vocational skills i.e. tailoring, beautician, embroidery, beads making, knitting and painting.





Emergency Preparedness & Awareness Sessions in KPK:

NCHD in collaboration with Rescue 1122, conducted awareness session for 100 volunteers in Kohat district covering emergency response, safety, First Aid and community preparedness. **In collaboration with PRCS and health department, 12 awareness sessions** were conducted on dengue, malaria, and drug abuse in coordination with health stakeholders.

Punjab CM's Meal Project:

The project is being implemented in 8 districts of South Punjab. NCHD is responsible for the monitoring of the supplies being provided and conduct a screening survey through tracking BMI assessment to check the impact of nutritional support and health fitness.

Community Learning Center Dhoke Hassu Islambad:

NCHD in collaboration with Akhter Hameed Khan Center had established a Community Learning Centre where around 50 females are acquiring literacy and vocational skills. Community members are actively engaged in the CLC and several awareness sessions are organized related to health, livestock and social welfare.

Adult Literacy Program for Troops Families Rawalpindi:

NCHD had established adult literacy centers at Troops Family Welfare Centers Pasbaan and Murree where the illiterate family members of the troops are acquiring literacy skills. NCHD is providing technical support and books in these centres, orientation sessions had been held successfully at both locations.

As the learners completed literacy course in Each One Teach One (EOTO), a comprehensive final assessment was conducted to evaluate the literacy skills of neo-literates. Dedicated volunteers, who have been instrumental in driving this movement, successfully assessed learners across all provinces.

This relentless effort has yielded remarkable results, with over 8,000 learners becoming literate by the end of December, marking a significant milestone in the initiative's journey towards creating a literate and empowered society.



NCHD Provincial Office Sindh marked a significant milestone by signing MoU with Benazir Bhutto Shaheed University Lyari (BBSUL) for the implementation of the Each One Teach One (EOTO) initiative.

NCHD Holds Meeting with UNICEF to Review Ongoing Projects and Expanded Education Initiative in KPK

In a significant stride towards enhancing education in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Director General NCHD, Mr. Ali Asghar, led a high-level delegation to a pivotal meeting with UNICEF officials, spearheaded by Education Specialist Mr. Fawad Ali Shah, in Abbottabad on December 24, 2025.


The meeting focused on reviewing progress and planning future collaborations, especially under the ongoing UNICEF-funded projects in six districts of the province, paving the way for expanded initiatives.

The discussions yielded a landmark agreement to amplify efforts, expanding project coverage to 20 districts across KP. This bold initiative aims to tackle the pressing issue of Out-of-School Children and bolster access to quality education for marginalized communities. The proposal includes developing School Development Plans (SDPs) for over 1,000 schools, creating a UC-based Out-of-School Children (OSC) digital Universal Primary Education (UPE) Register, and conducting a province-wide private schools registration survey.

Visit of Rehabilitation Centre to Review Rehabilitation and Skill Development Initiatives

In a heartwarming display of compassion and commitment, Director General NCHD, Mr. Ali Asghar, led a delegation to District Jail Abbottabad on December 24, 2025. Accompanied by Director Operations KP, Mr. Anwar Iqbal, and the Provincial office team, the visit aimed to review rehabilitation and skill development initiatives.

The team was impressed by the progress of Drug Rehabilitation Center, established to support inmates struggling with addiction. Three batches have already completed rehabilitation, with the fourth batch underway. The center's success is a testament to the tireless efforts of the Abbottabad team, particularly Mr. Shoib Sadiq, Field Officer.



The skill development programs and other rehabilitation initiatives implemented by the Jail superintendent for inmates were highly appreciated. As part of their welfare support, the delegation distributed blankets and books under the Each One Teaches initiative, promoting education and learning among prisoners. The visit concluded with the presentation of shields, recognizing outstanding cooperation and joint efforts.

Visit of Temporary Learning Centre by DG NCHD in Mansehra

On 24 December 2025, Director General NCHD, Mr. Ali Asghar, along with Director Operations KP Mr. Anwar Iqbal and the Provincial Office KP team, visited Temporary Learning Space District Mansehra and under the Education Recovery Project.

The Temporary Learning Centre provides a safe and supportive learning environment to minimize disruption to children's education. The Director General encouraged community members to support maximum enrollment of children to ensure access to basic education and learning facilities, and appreciated the active participation and support of community as well.



The Temporary Learning Space was formally inaugurated by the Director General NCHD, followed by the distribution of school bags and essential learning materials among enrolled children.
